## **FURTHER READING:**

An attractive and an interesting succulent tree that is commonly used as a house plant, but if planted in the ground in our near frost free climate, it will grow to a massive and broad tree that is 7.5 metres tall and as wide and, with great age, even larger - one of the tallest ever recorded was over 21 metres tall. The terminal ends of the thick branches hold clusters of 10cm long by 3.5cm wide pliable sword-shaped blue-green leaves. This plant should not be confused with the much widely planted Yucca elephantipes. Yucca elephantipes is a spikey, quick growing Yucca, that grows extremely large, often out growing its planted situation.
