A compact rosette-forming succulent with broad, short, squared-off blue-gray leaves which have prominent reddish-brown teeth and terminal spines. Individual plants grow to 0.7 - 1 metre tall by 1 - 1.5 metres wide. Plant in full sun. It requires very little to no irrigation in coastal gardens and is hardy to around -12° C. This agave, native from Durango to Zacatecas Mexico, is very attractive in the succulent garden as a large specimen plant or in large pots.
