FURTHER READING:

A large succulent that grows into a tree 9 metres tall or more with upright-growing thick mottled gray stems. In late winter, the rose-pink flowers, in a tight inflorescence, rise above the foliage. Plant in full sun or light shade in a fairly well drained soil, and irrigate only occasionally to infrequently. It is a great tree for the succulent garden and is fairly clean, so good near a pool and can be kept many years in a large container.
